

## Information on State and Local Assessments

Valley School students participate in formative and summative assessments each year to measure how well students are meeting academic goals in language arts, math and science. Assessment data helps teachers plan lessons and provide support for individual students.

Parent/guardians are provided individual student achievement report(s) which will be discussed with your child's teacher at conferences in the fall and spring.

## Citizen Complaints Concerning Federal Programs

Valley School directs Title I funding to support/supplement regular instruction through focused, customized one-on-one or small group instruction, extra learning supports and materials, and para-educator aide in the classroom.

## Parent & Family Engagement Opportunities

Valley School encourages you to partner with your child's school staff and actively engage in opportunities to help your student develop, learn and be involved.

- Attend monthly Family Engagement Committee (FEC) meetings.
- Attend Open House, meetings, and other events to receive information about Title I programs and develop/evaluate school engagement policies.
- Request meetings with your child's teacher for help or training when needed.
- Be involved in school activities and opportunities to plan and evaluate school activities and programs.

## Parent Rights to Request Teacher and Para-educator Qualifications

Every parent/guardian has the right to know the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher(s) and para-educator(s), including whether the teacher has met Washington certification requirements for the grade level and subjects in which they are teaching and other details.

Additionally, parents must be informed by the school if their child is being taught (for four or more weeks) by a teacher with limited state certification/licensure, such as an emergency or conditional certificate.
